- Agricultural Development: Facilitating programs that enhance agricultural practices among local farmers.



PROGRESS DURING THE YEAR

PROGRAM 1: KUSHAL YUVA PROGRAM

The Bihar Skill Development Mission (BSDM) has initiated an innovative skill training program known as the **Kushal Yuva Program** (**KYP**). This program is a key component of the "7 Commitments," specifically "Aarthik Hal, Yuvaon Ko Bal," aimed at enhancing the employability of Bihar's youth.

Program Overview

The Kushal Yuva Program targets individuals aged 15 to 28 years who have completed at least the 10th grade, regardless of their current educational status. For specific categories, the age limit is extended: SC/ST and Persons with Disabilities (PwD) up to 33 years, and OBC up to 31 years. The program emphasizes the development of essential soft skills, including Life Skills, Communication Skills (in both English and Hindi), and Basic Computer Literacy.

These skills are designed to significantly enhance the employability prospects of participants and serve as a valuable complement to various domain-specific training initiatives currently underway in Bihar.

Training Structure

The KYP encompasses a comprehensive training curriculum structured over **240 hours**, divided as follows:

- Life Skills: 40 hours

- Communication Skills: 80 hours- Basic Computer Literacy: 120 hours

In the fiscal year **2023-24**, RASS, with the support of BSDM, successfully implemented this program, training a total of **532 youth** (218 male and 314 female), thereby improving their employability skills.







Addressing Skill Development Challenges

The KYP strategically addresses four critical challenges within the skill development ecosystem:

- **Capacity**: Increasing training capacity by establishing at least one Skill Development Centre (SDC) in each of Bihar's 534 blocks.
- Access: Enhancing accessibility through localized training centers that bring education directly to youth.
- **Relevance**: Ensuring that training content is pertinent to current job market demands, facilitating smoother transitions from home to employment.
- **Perception**: Improving public perception through qualified trainers and high-quality content delivery via elearning platforms.

Global Context

In light of global megatrends such as technological advancements, climate change, demographic shifts, urbanization, and globalization, there is an increasing need for youth to acquire a diverse skill set. The KYP aims to equip participants with cognitive skills, socio-emotional skills, and technical expertise necessary for success in the 21st-century labor market.

In Sheikhpura district alone, **more than 80 youths** benefited from this training initiative in 2023-24, further underscoring the program's impact on enhancing employability among Bihar's youth. Through such comprehensive skill development efforts, the Kushal Yuva Program continues to play a pivotal role in shaping a skilled workforce ready to meet evolving industry demands.

Post-Training Support Mechanism

To ensure the continued success of participants in the Kushal Yuva Program, a robust Post-Training Support Mechanism has been established. This mechanism is designed to enhance job prospects and facilitate the transition from training to employment for skilled youth.

- **Registration on the NCS Portal**: All trained youth are registered on the National Career Service (NCS) Portal, providing them with enhanced visibility to potential employers. Each participant receives a registration card along with a course completion book, which serves as a valuable credential in their job search.
- **Participation in Job Fairs**: The program actively facilitates the participation of skilled youth in district-level Job Mela and recruitment camps. This initiative not only connects participants with potential employers but also provides them with firsthand experience in job-seeking environments.
- **Resume Preparation and Interview Readiness**: To further support employability, assistance is provided in preparing professional resumes for participants aged 18 and above. Additionally, mock interviews and preparatory sessions are conducted to equip candidates with the skills and confidence needed to succeed in real interview scenarios.
- **Certificate Distribution**: Successful candidates receive certificates upon completion of their training, formally recognizing their achievements and enhancing their employability credentials.

As a result of these comprehensive support mechanisms, **more than 150 skilled youth** have successfully secured employment opportunities to date. This ongoing commitment to post-training support underscores our dedication to empowering youth and facilitating their integration into the workforce.

PROGRAM 2: VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM

RASS is committed to the belief that women's economic participation and empowerment are essential for strengthening women's rights and enabling them to have control over their lives. Economic empowerment is not only a prerequisite for sustainable development but also a catalyst for advancing gender equality and enhancing development efforts. Throughout the fiscal year 2023-24, RASS continued its dedicated efforts in this direction, supported by community contributions and donations.

The Vocational Training Program successfully reached 77 poor and marginalized women and girls in our operational districts in Bihar. Participants engaged in income-generating vocational skills training under the guidance of expert trainers, equipping them with the necessary tools to improve their economic status.



Training Details

The program offered training in various trades, with beneficiaries distributed as follows:

Through this initiative, RASS has empowered women to become self-reliant, increase their income, and raise their living standards. The skills acquired through this program not only enhance individual livelihoods but also contribute to the broader goal of fostering women's leadership and participation in the economy.

PROGRAM 3: SAFE ABORTION PROGRAM

Over the past two decades, advancements in health evidence, technology, and human rights have underscored the necessity of providing safe and comprehensive abortion care. Despite these developments, an estimated 22 million abortions are still performed unsafely each year, leading to approximately 47,000 maternal deaths and disabilities for an additional 5 million women. In Bihar, access to safe abortion services has become increasingly limited, primarily benefiting wealthier individuals while poorer women in rural areas often resort to unsafe providers. This trend results in preventable deaths and morbidities that ultimately burden the public health system.



At RASS, we firmly believe that everyone has the right to safe and legal abortion services, as well as access to information about post-abortion care and contraception. Throughout **2023-24**, RASS actively engaged with local communities by organizing village meetings and discussions with both direct and indirect stakeholders in Sheikhpura, Bihar. Approximately **50 women** were educated about their rights regarding legal abortion services, post-abortion care, and available contraception options.

PROGRAM 4: SEMINAR ON THE PC-PNDT ACT

Prenatal child sex determination and female infanticide have long been critical issues in India. According to the latest census data, these practices continue to persist, contributing to a national female-male sex ratio that has reached an alarming low of **933 females per 1,000 males**. In Bihar, the situation is even more concerning, with a reported sex ratio of **916 females per 1,000 males**, and the ratio for children aged 0-6 years standing at **933**.

To address these pressing issues and raise awareness about the **Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques** (**PC-PNDT**) **Act**, RASS organized a seminar on **September 22, 2023**, at Sanskritik Bhawan in the Ariyari block of Sheikhpura district, Bihar. The seminar featured insightful discussions led by experienced resource persons who elaborated on the implications of the unequal sex ratio across India.

The event brought together a diverse group of participants, including Self-Help Group (SHG) women leaders, ASHA workers, government officials, Panchayati Raj Institution (PRI) members, representatives from various NGOs and voluntary organizations, as well as youth groups. Their active participation

contributed significantly to the seminar's success.

This initiative underscores RASS's commitment to combating gender-based discrimination and promoting awareness of the legal frameworks designed to protect female rights. By educating communities about the PC-PNDT Act and its importance in curbing practices like female feticide, RASS aims to foster a more equitable society where every girl child is valued and protected.



PROGRAM 5: CHILD TRAFFICKING AND WELFARE PROGRAM

Child trafficking remains a critical issue, representing the exploitation of both girls and boys primarily for forced labor and sexual exploitation. Alarmingly, children account for 27% of all human trafficking victims globally, with two out of every three child victims being girls. These children are often sold by family members or lured by false promises of education and a better life. Tragically, trafficked children endure slave-like conditions, lacking adequate food, shelter, and clothing, and are frequently subjected to severe abuse while being cut off from their families.

In Bihar, the situation is dire, with vulnerable children—particularly refugees and migrants—falling prey to traffickers who exploit their hopes for education and a better future.

Every country is affected by human trafficking, resulting in children dropping out of school and being deprived of their fundamental right to a safe and secure upbringing.

At RASS, we are committed to preventing child trafficking and rehabilitating victims. We focus on strengthening community awareness regarding child protection issues and government welfare programs aimed at supporting trafficked children. Throughout 2023-24, RASS organized regular awareness camps in Sheikhpura district, educating the community about the detrimental effects of trafficking and the government's efforts to combat this malpractice.



PROGRAM 6: BIHAR STATE-CERTIFICATE IN FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING (BS-CFA)

The Bihar Financial and Capital Market Association (BFCFA) is committed to enhancing financial literacy and investment capabilities in Bihar, fostering a robust financial ecosystem for local businesses and individuals. As part of this initiative, the Bihar State-Certificate in Financial Accounting (BS-CFA) course has been introduced to equip youth with essential skills in financial accounting and GST compliance. This course is particularly targeted at students who have completed their 12th grade, aiming to improve their employability and self-employability.



In Sheikhpura district, BFCFA is actively running the BS-CFA program, which spans 120 hours and is offered at no cost to participants. The course is delivered through newly established Skill Development Centers across all 101 sub-divisions of Bihar, utilizing the BSDM's eLearning Management System for quality course delivery. The curriculum includes critical topics such as financial accounting principles, GST regulations, and practical training with Tally software. By focusing on both practical skills and theoretical knowledge, the BS-CFA course aims to create a skilled workforce capable of supporting small and medium enterprises in filing GST returns effectively, thereby contributing to the economic development of the region.



PROGRAM 7: ROAD SAFETY PROGRAM

In 2023-24, Ragho Seva Sangathan launched an essential Road Safety Program to address the growing concerns around road safety, particularly in rural and semi-urban areas of Bihar. The initiative, held in July, was launched in response to the increasing number of road accidents, with a significant rise in fatalities involving young people and pedestrians. According to the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) report, road traffic accidents in India saw an upward trend in recent years, with the most vulnerable groups being motorcyclists and pedestrians. In Bihar, inadequate awareness and adherence to traffic rules were found to be major contributors to this increase. The program aimed to reduce accidents and fatalities by educating the local population, especially youth, about safe road practices. Schools, community centers, and local markets were key locations for interactive workshops, where participants were taught importance of wearing helmets, using seatbelts, following traffic signals, and avoiding distractions while driving. The sessions also emphasized the dangers of reckless driving, speeding, and not adhering to traffic laws, which are key contributors to the rise in accidents.



Street plays, skits, and other forms of interactive storytelling were used to engage the community, particularly the younger population, and raise awareness of the risks associated with unsafe road practices. In addition, Ragho Seva Sangathan collaborated with local authorities to distribute educational pamphlets and conduct vehicle checks, ensuring public transport vehicles met safety standards.

The program successfully reached hundreds of individuals, with an especially strong impact on the youth, who often make up a significant portion of road accident victims. Feedback from the community reflected a greater understanding of road safety and a commitment to making safer choices on the roads.

PROGRAM 8: AIDS AWARENESS PROGRAM

In 2023-24, Ragho Seva Sangathan launched an AIDS Awareness Program to address the stigma surrounding HIV/AIDS and increase knowledge about prevention, treatment, and care in rural and semi-urban areas of Bihar. The initiative, held in **september**, aimed to educate the community about the realities of HIV/AIDS, its transmission, and the importance of early testing and regular health check-ups.

The program was launched in response to concerns over the rising HIV prevalence in Bihar, particularly among high-risk groups such as migrant workers and youth. Despite national awareness campaigns, misinformation and stigma continue to hinder effective HIV prevention and care. According to the National AIDS Control Organisation (NACO), Bihar has a significant number of HIV-positive individuals, and rural areas often lack access to vital health information and services.

Ragho Seva Sangathan organized workshops and informational sessions in schools, health centers, and local markets. These sessions focused on HIV transmission, prevention strategies, and the importance of safe practices.



PROGRAM 9: SEMINAR ON HEALTH AND HYGIENE

In 2023-24, Ragho Seva Sangathan organized a seminar to raise awareness about health and hygiene, focusing on rural communities in Bihar. The seminar aimed to educate individuals on the importance of maintaining proper hygiene to prevent diseases and promote overall well-being.

In many rural areas, limited access to clean water, sanitation facilities, and hygiene education contributes to the spread of infections. The World Health Organization (WHO) highlights that poor hygiene practices can lead to gastrointestinal diseases, respiratory infections, and skin conditions. The seminar emphasized the significance of personal hygiene, safe sanitation habits, and disease prevention through proper handwashing and waste management.

Health experts, community leaders, and local authorities led discussions on maintaining hygiene in daily life. Key topics included the importance of clean drinking water, the safe disposal of waste, and the role of balanced nutrition in strengthening immunity. The initiative aimed to equip participants with practical knowledge to adopt healthier lifestyles and improve public health standards in their communities.



PROGRAM 10: SEMINAR ON ENVIRONMENT

In 2023-24, Ragho Seva Sangathan organized a seminar to raise awareness about menstrual hygiene and health, targeting women and girls in rural Bihar. The seminar aimed to address the stigma surrounding menstruation, promote safe hygiene practices, and highlight the importance of access to menstrual products. In many rural communities, menstruation is often surrounded by myths, leading to poor hygiene and health issues. The World Health Organization (WHO) emphasizes that improper menstrual hygiene can lead to reproductive health problems, including infections. The seminar focused on educating participants about safe menstrual practices, proper sanitation, and the use of hygienic products.

Health experts, community leaders, and local authorities led discussions on managing menstruation in a healthy and dignified manner. Key topics included the safe disposal of sanitary products, the risks of using unhygienic materials, and the importance of nutrition for menstrual health.

The seminar reached a wide audience, empowering women and girls with the knowledge to manage their menstrual health effectively. Participants reported a better understanding of menstrual hygiene and expressed confidence in adopting healthier practices. The initiative also helped reduce the stigma associated with menstruation, contributing to improved health outcomes in the community.

Ragho Seva Sangathan's seminar played a crucial role in promoting menstrual hygiene awareness and supporting women's health in rural Bihar.
