

- Cultural Development: Fostering traditional arts, crafts, and Indian music to preserve cultural heritage.
- Child Welfare Initiatives: Conducting programs aimed at the holistic development of children and eradicating child labour.
- Agricultural Development: Facilitating programs that enhance agricultural practices among local farmers.
- Support Services for Women: Establishing counseling centers and shelters for destitute women, including those who are socially excluded or have faced violence.
- Youth and Community Development: Implementing welfare schemes that promote the overall development of women, youth, and children while addressing social evils.
- Livelihood Generation: Providing training and opportunities for sustainable livelihood creation.
- Environmental Awareness: Conducting initiatives aimed at maintaining a clean environment.
- Complementary Programs: Conducting, organizing, and facilitating additional programs and activities that support and complement the organization's objectives for social development as a whole.



PROGRESS DURING THE YEAR

PROGRAM 1: KUSHAL YUVA PROGRAM

The **Kushal Yuva Program (KYP)**, under the Bihar Skill Development Mission (BSDM), is part of the state's "7 Commitments" agenda – *Aarthik Hal, Yuvaon Ko Bal.* The initiative aims to improve the employability of young people in Bihar through essential **life, communication, and computer skills**.

The program is open to youth aged 15–28 years (with relaxations for SC/ST, OBC, and PwD) who have completed at least the 10th grade. Training spans 240 hours:

- Life Skills 40 hours
- Communication Skills 80 hours
- Basic Computer Literacy 120 hours

In 2023–24, RASS, with BSDM's support, trained **532 youth** (222 boys and 310 girls). In 2024–25, **689 youth** from Sheikhpura (328 male, 361 female) benefited.

The program addresses major skilling challenges:

- Expanding **capacity** through Skill Development Centers in all 534 blocks.
- Improving access via localized training.
- Ensuring **relevance** with market-linked content.
- Shaping **perception** through quality trainers and e-learning delivery.



To strengthen outcomes, a **Post-Training Support Mechanism** is in place. Trained youth are registered on the **National Career Service (NCS) Portal**, connected with employers through **job fairs**, and supported in **resume preparation and interview readiness**. Certificates further enhance their employment credentials.

As a result, **232 participants have secured employment** to date, reflecting the impact of the program in equipping Bihar's youth with workplace-ready skills.



PROGRAM 2: VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM

RASS believes that women's economic empowerment is central to gender equality and sustainable development. In 2024–25, with the support of community contributions and donations, RASS provided vocational training to 87 poor and marginalized women and girls across its operational districts in Bihar.

Participants were trained in **income-generating trades** under the guidance of expert trainers, enabling them to gain practical skills for self-reliance and improved livelihoods.

The program not only helped women increase their income and living standards but also fostered confidence, leadership, and participation in local economies.

Through these efforts, RASS continues to empower women with the tools and opportunities necessary for an independent and dignified life, reinforcing its commitment to inclusive and sustainable community development.

PROGRAM 3: CHILD TRAFFICKING AND WELFARE PROGRAM

Child trafficking remains a grave concern, with children making up 27% of global trafficking victims—two out of three being girls. Trafficked children are often deceived with false promises or sold into forced labor and sexual exploitation, enduring abuse, poor living conditions, and separation from families.

In Bihar, vulnerable groups such as **refugee and migrant children** are especially at risk, with trafficking leading to school dropouts and the denial of a safe childhood.

In 2024–25, RASS organized regular awareness camps in Sheikhpura district to educate communities about the risks of trafficking and the available government welfare programs for prevention and rehabilitation.



Through these initiatives, RASS works to strengthen child protection, build community vigilance, and empower families to resist traffickers' false promises. Our goal is to ensure that every child grows up in an environment of safety, dignity, and opportunity.

PROGRAM 4: SEMINAR ON ENVIRONMENT

In 2024–25, Ragho Seva Sangathan (RASS) organized a **seminar on environmental awareness**, engaging community members, youth, and local leaders in rural Bihar. The initiative aimed to highlight the importance of protecting natural resources and adopting sustainable practices to address challenges such as deforestation, waste management, and water conservation.

Sessions were led by environmental experts and educators, who discussed everyday actions to reduce pollution, conserve energy, and promote tree plantation. Interactive activities, including group discussions and demonstrations, helped participants understand the link between environmental protection and community well-being.

The seminar created a platform for **collective responsibility**, encouraging participants to adopt eco-friendly habits and spread awareness within their villages. Feedback indicated a positive shift in understanding, particularly among youth, who pledged to take active roles in environmental protection.

Through this initiative, RASS strengthened community awareness on sustainability, reinforcing its commitment to building a cleaner, healthier, and greener future.



PROGRAM 5: ROAD SAFETY PROGRAM

In 2024–25, Ragho Seva Sangathan (RASS) initiated a **Road Safety Program** in Sheikhpura district to address the growing concern of rising road accidents in Bihar. According to the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), road traffic accidents have been increasing across India, with motorcyclists, pedestrians, and youth identified as the most vulnerable groups. In Bihar, lack of awareness and poor compliance with traffic rules continue to be major causes of these accidents.

The program focused on educating communities—particularly youth—on safe road practices. Interactive workshops were conducted in schools, markets, and community spaces to highlight the importance of wearing helmets, using seatbelts, following traffic signals, and avoiding reckless driving. Engaging methods such as street plays and skits were used to communicate key messages in a relatable way.

In collaboration with local authorities, RASS also distributed **educational pamphlets** and conducted **vehicle safety checks** to ensure public transport vehicles met basic standards.

The initiative reached **hundreds of individuals**, fostering greater awareness and commitment toward safer road behavior. Through this program, RASS contributed to creating a more responsible and secure road environment in the community.

PROGRAM 6: BIHAR STATE-CERTIFICATE IN FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING (BS-CFA)

To empower youth with essential financial skills, **BFCFA**, in collaboration with **BSDM**, has extended the **Bihar State-Certificate in Financial Accounting (BS-CFA)** course to **Sheikhpura district** during the 2024-25 rollout. This **120-hour**, **free-of-cost** program offers participants—particularly 12th-pass students—hands-on training in financial accounting, GST compliance, and Tally software—crucial skills for navigating modern financial environments.

In 2023–24, the program trained **168 youth,** including 81 boys and 87 girls, while in **2024–25**, it enrolled **128 youth,** comprising 68 boys and 60 girls—demonstrating its steady expansion and emphasis on inclusive participation.

The course modules include:

- Fundamentals of financial accounting,
- GST principles and their application,
- Practical exercises using Tally software for bookkeeping and reporting.

BS-CFA in Sheikhpura operates through local **Skill Development Centres**, integrating BSDM's **e-Learning Management System** to ensure consistent and high-quality instruction across locations.



By situating the program locally and making it accessible, RASS aligns with its mission to enhance youth employability and promote economic self-reliance. This initiative helps equip young people with practical accounting skills, enabling them to support small and medium enterprises and foster financial growth within their communities.



PROGRAM 7: SEMINAR ON HEALTH AND HYGIENE

In 2024–25, RASS organized a seminar on health and hygiene, with special focus on women and adolescent girls in rural Bihar. The program aimed to create awareness on maintaining personal hygiene, preventing infections, and promoting overall well-being.

The seminar addressed a wide range of topics, including safe menstrual practices, proper sanitation, clean drinking water, balanced nutrition, and the importance of handwashing in daily life. Health experts, community leaders, and local authorities led interactive sessions, encouraging participants to openly discuss challenges and adopt practical solutions.



By dispelling myths and misconceptions, the initiative empowered women and girls to take charge of their health, while also promoting hygiene practices within families and communities. Feedback revealed that participants gained a stronger understanding of preventive healthcare, greater confidence in managing personal hygiene, and a commitment to spreading awareness in their villages.

Through this initiative, RASS strengthened its efforts toward healthier communities, reduced stigma around sensitive health issues, and reinforced its commitment to women's well-being and public health.

PROGRAM 8: AIDS AWARENESS PROGRAM

In 2024–25, Ragho Seva Sangathan (RASS) implemented an **AIDS Awareness Program** in rural and semiurban areas of Bihar to tackle stigma and improve community knowledge on HIV/AIDS prevention, testing, and care. The program responded to rising concerns, particularly among **migrant workers and youth**, who remain among the most at-risk groups in the state.

Through workshops in schools, health centers, and community spaces, participants were educated about HIV transmission, prevention strategies, and the importance of early testing. In collaboration with local health authorities, mobile health units were deployed to provide free HIV testing, ensuring access for marginalized groups with limited healthcare facilities.

The initiative reached **hundreds of individuals**, fostering greater awareness, reducing stigma, and promoting safe health practices. Participant feedback reflected a stronger understanding of HIV prevention and treatment options, marking a step forward in community health empowerment. By bridging the gap between awareness and accessibility, RASS continues to contribute to Bihar's fight against HIV/AIDS.

PROGRAM 9: SEMINAR ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING

In 2024–25, Ragho Seva Sangathan (RASS) organized a **seminar on human trafficking** to raise awareness about the growing risks faced by women and children in Bihar. The initiative was designed to highlight the tactics used by traffickers and the urgent need for collective community action.

The seminar brought together law enforcement officials, social workers, and human rights activists, who shared insights on legal safeguards, prevention strategies, and the role of community vigilance in combating trafficking.



Participants were educated on identifying early warning signs and the importance of reporting suspicious activities. The program witnessed strong participation from **local authorities**, **community leaders**, **and residents**, many of whom committed to taking active roles in prevention efforts.

By creating a platform for dialogue and action, RASS helped strengthen community awareness, encourage collaboration, and promote protection of vulnerable groups. The seminar reinforced the organization's commitment to safeguarding human rights and combating exploitation in the region.
